

Bubbeh Lee and Me

THIS SWEET "DOCU-DIARY" about 32-year-old Andy Abrahams Wilson's visit to his grandmother in Florida was shot mostly with a handheld camera—in Wilson's hands. We tag along as Andy and Bubbeh Lee go shopping in the local grocery store, chat about her family's journey to America, and bump into countless friends and neighbors who remark on how wonderful "single" Andy is and how they have a granddaughter who would be perfect for him. Though Wilson's voice-over narration can be grating, the overall tone is gentle, even as they talk about Bubbeh Lee's unhappy childhood, her inability to show affection to her

children, and her thoughts about Andy's being gay. When they're driving and she tells Andy to go straight and he makes the inevitable joke, her amused reaction makes even that chestnut a little fresher. (Airing on HBO through October 27.)
